For Aquinas, it is a principle of his epistemology that "nothing is in the intellect which was not first in the senses." Therefore, in order for us to know anything, we must think of it in a sensory sort of way, making use of images (phantasms in Aquinas' terminology) (*Summa Theologiae* Ia, q. 84, a. 6; 85, 1). Even the most abstract sorts of thoughts involve the use of some sort of phantasm.

Knowing God - Thomistic Philosophy

Thomistic Philosophy is inspired by the philosophical methods and principles used by Thomas Aquinas (1224/5-1274), a Dominican Friar and Theologian, in his explanation of the Catholic faith. Aquinas, who is most renowned for his Five Ways of Proving the Existence of God, believed that both faith and reason discover truth, a conflict between them being impossible since they both originate in God.

Overview. Practical reason is understood by most philosophers as determining a plan of action. Thomistic ethics defines the first principle of practical reason as "good is to be done and pursued, and evil is to be avoided." For Kant, practical reason has a law-abiding quality because the categorical imperative is understood to be binding one to one's duty rather than subjective preferences.
