The primary source about the Philistines is the Hebrew Bible, but they are first attested in reliefs at the Temple of Ramses III at Medinet Habu, where they are called Peleset (𐤀𐤏𐤋𐤍𐤏𐤋𐤏𐤋𐤏𐤋𐤏𐤋𐤏𐤋), accepted as cognate with Hebrew P'léšet.
